Invitation to founding conference of the Global Nicotine Forum

Toronto, June 13, 2016: Tobacco Harm Reduction Association of Canada ("THRA") today announced that after months of discussions and planning it will attend the third annual Global Forum on Nicotine Conference to be held in Warsaw Poland this coming June 16th, 17th & 18th. Two of the highlights of this year's conference will be the establishment of an international network or coalition of nicotine consumer organizations with Canadian consumers represented by THRA. The Global Forum on Nicotine Conference was begun to bring science and policy making together. The context was "that the science and understanding of nicotine is rapidly changing. This has implications for many sectors including consumers, researchers, regulators, public health, tobacco control, policy analysts, and industry.
